University Housing at the University of Illinois welcomes you as you begin your graduate or professional studies. As you are making arrangements to attend the University, we are excited to share this information about the various housing options that are available to you. Our welcoming and culturally diverse community provides several different housing choices that are well suited for single graduate and professional students and for those students with families. Whether you select a traditional Graduate residence hall or apartment style living, you will find that each housing option offers you safe, affordable and convenient accommodations.

This information sheet describes the two Graduate Residence Halls and how you can join the community. Also included are a Contract Form and Assignment Preference Application and the Terms and Condition of the Graduate Residence Hall Contract. Please take a moment to read this over and feel free to visit our web site at www.housing.illinois.edu for more details.

Who lives in Graduate Residence Halls?

Graduate students and older undergraduate students from a variety of cultural, ethnic, and racial backgrounds live together, creating a "world in one community". Community activities and events are offered to help our residents meet new neighbors, become acquainted with the University and local community, and incorporate personal and academic growth into their everyday lives.

Why are the University Residence Halls a great place to call home?

Our traditional Graduate residence halls, *Sherman Hall* and *Daniels Hall*, are both high-rise buildings that provide private and shared rooms. Students enjoy a private or semi-private bathroom, air-conditioned facilities, ethernet access in each room, and a community that is academically focused.

Both *Sherman Hall* and *Daniels Hall* are within walking distance to the majority of academic buildings. *Sherman Hall* is located near the International Studies Building consisting mainly of single rooms. Either two or three single rooms share one bathroom. *Daniels Hall* is located in a prime location on the northeast side of campus near the Illini Union and the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts. An exciting renovation project in *Daniels Hall* was completed in Fall 2001. We have expanded and updated student rooms and redesigned the lobby and lounges. As you may imagine, there is tremendous demand for the newly renovated spaces in *Daniels Hall*. Returning residents fill most spaces in Daniels, but there may still be some rooms available.

Get Involved!

Many exciting leadership opportunities await you in Graduate Housing! We hope you will become involved in one of the residents' councils for your hall. The **Social-Action Teams** are eager to have you participate. They often sponsor the weekly coffee hour, along with the Graduate Resident Advisor staff. They are very active in shaping the hall community. The **Social-Action Team** advises the hall staff on many community issues. The **Social-Action Teams** also help to provide social opportunities for residents.

Meal Plan Options

There are eight dining facilities located throughout campus and a variety of meal plans that are available for student meals. While meal plans are optional for Graduate Hall residents, please note that cooking is not allowed in student rooms and no kitchen facilities are available for regular meal preparation in the halls.

You have the option to select a meal plan now or wait until after you arrive on campus to decide. Many graduate students buy individual meal tickets when they arrive on campus to sample our Dining Services before making their decision. Dining rooms are located in nearby Undergraduate Residence Halls. Residents of Daniels Hall often cross the street to use the Illinois Street Dining Hall. The closest University Dining facility to Sherman Hall is about 4 blocks away. Carryout options are available from some locations. With our free-flow option, students are able to eat in any dining facility making it a convenient choice around campus. Please visit the Dining website for more information on our services and locations. Below we have described some of your meal plan options.

You have the choice of three types of meal plans: Plans with Classic Meals and Café Credits, plans with Classic meals only, and an All Café Credits plan. Classic meals are all-you-care-to-eat breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Café Credits and Extra Credits are used in A La Carte locations, where items are priced individually—you purchase only what you wish. Credits can also be used to purchase a Classic meal, or to treat a friend to a Classic Meal or A La Carte items. Café Credits are purchased as part of a meal plan. How to apply...

In order to secure University Housing, complete and return the accompanying Contract Form and Assignment Preference Application with a \$200 payment. The \$200 payment must be drawn in U.S. funds and made payable to the University of Illinois. If you are sending a U.S. Traveler's check, remember to sign **both lines** on the Traveler's check that require a signature. ~~You also have the option of submitting the contract online and paying the \$200 advance payment with a credit card.~~ **Remember** that by signing and returning a contract for University Residence Halls, you are responsible for honoring that contract if you attend the University of Illinois.

How are Assignments Made?

Students are assigned in order of the date the signed contract form and advance payment is received by Housing. All assignments are based on space availability. We will begin to make assignments in mid-June for Fall. Written confirmation of your hall assignment will be sent by late July. Spring semester assignment notices are sent in late December.

Early Arrival

Contracts for Sherman and Daniels begin on Thursday, August 20, 2009 for Fall semester and continue through May 15, 2010. The halls open for Spring semester on January 17, 2010. Any student wishing to move in prior to the official opening must submit an Early Arrival Request at <http://www.housing.illinois.edu/Apply/Early%20Late%20Request.aspx>. An early check-in fee will be assessed for each night prior to August 20 (January 17 for Spring semester). The early arrival charge is billed to your University student account.

1. The Student agrees to pay the applicable rate for the space to which assigned.
 - a. **ACADEMIC YEAR (9 month):** This Contract begins August 20, 2009, and extends through the last day of spring semester final examinations (May 15, 2010). The Student agrees to assume all obligations provided in this "Graduate Residence Hall Contract, Academic Year 2009-2010." The advance payment will be applied to the spring semester charge.
 - b. **12-MONTH CONTRACT:** This Contract begins August 20, 2009, and extends through the last day of summer semester final examinations (August 7, 2010). The Student agrees to assume all obligations provided in this "Graduate Residence Hall Contract, Academic Year 2009-2010." The advance payment will be applied to the spring semester charge.
2. The University agrees to provide housing accommodations for the Student subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The return of the signed Contract Form and Assignment Preference Application with a \$200 payment (\$150 advance payment and \$50 non-refundable application fee), payable to "University of Illinois," to the Cashier, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, 100B Henry Administration Building, 506 South Wright Street, Urbana, IL 61801-3620. Acceptance of the Contract is subject to available space. If space is not available, the Contract will not be accepted and the advance payment will be refunded. The Contract is for **SPACE ONLY**, and the Student agrees to accept any accommodation the University assigns, including temporary space. The Contract is valid when signed and received by the University even though specific room assignments will not be mailed until mid-July, or later if your Contract is received after June 15. After sending a Graduate Residence Halls Contract you should make no other housing arrangements before checking with Housing concerning the status of your Contract, as it is binding when received, even if you have not received your room assignment.
 - b. After the \$150 advance payment is made, the amount due each semester is billed through University Student Financial Services & Cashier Operations. Please refer to the USFSCO e-bill website for billing information. <https://epay.uillinois.edu/ebills.html>
 - c. Student's failure to satisfy the financial obligations accrued under this Contract in accordance with the payment schedule outlined in Contract section 2b may result, at the sole option of the University, in the denial of further meals or contract cancellation pursuant to University rules and regulations.
3. **DURATION OF CONTRACT:** The Contract is binding upon the Student for the entire academic year. The Student may be released from the Contract if the Student requests a release in writing, postmarked before midnight, May 15 (March 3 Room Reassignment contracts or December 1 for a Student first entering into a Residence Hall Contract beginning the spring semester), and mails it to the address shown in 6a below. If the Student leaves the University, but registers again during that academic year, the Student is obligated to fulfill the terms of the Contract.
THE CONTRACT CANNOT BE CANCELLED AFTER MAY 15 OR MARCH 3 (REASSIGNED STUDENTS) FOR A CONTRACT BEGINNING FALL SEMESTER 2009 OR AFTER DECEMBER 1 FOR A CONTRACT BEGINNING SPRING SEMESTER 2010, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 4.
4. **RELEASE PROVISIONS:** Beginning May 16 or March 4 (Reassigned students) for fall semester and December 2 for a Residence Hall Contract beginning spring semester, the Student will be released from this Contract only for one of the following reasons: (See Section 5 concerning advance payment forfeiture.)
 - a. Not attending the University.
 - b. Marriage, if living with spouse in the community.
 - c. Significant unforeseen health reason occurring **after** the Contract cancellation deadline. A request for release for this reason must be documented by the Student, reviewed and approved.
 - d. Participation in Study Abroad, Co-Op, Internship Program, or Student Teaching out of the Champaign-Urbana area.
 - e. Called to active duty for military service.
 - f. If a, b, c, or d, above is not applicable and the Student with a room-only Contract desires release from the Contract, such release will be granted upon payment of up to \$2,000 prorated for the weeks remaining in the academic year, plus full charges through the week of cancellation, with credit for the remaining weeks as explained in section 6b.

5. **REFUND OF ADVANCE PAYMENT UPON RELEASE FROM CONTRACT: THE ACADEMIC YEAR CONTRACT CANNOT BE CANCELED AFTER MAY 15 OR MARCH 3 FOR REASSIGNED STUDENTS** (and a new contract beginning spring semester cannot be canceled after December 1), except as provided in section 4.
- a. **Full Refund:** If the Student mails a written request for release from the Contract postmarked before midnight May 1, to the address in section 6a, **the full \$150 advance payment will be refunded. After May 15 (March 3 for Reassigned students) a refund of the entire advance payment will be made only for the following reasons, provided notification of cancellation is received by Housing in writing with verification enclosed from a University department, or physician, or a copy of a marriage license:**
- 1) Not admitted by the University or dismissed for academic reasons.
 - 2) Personal illness resulting in withdrawal from the University.
 - 3) Continued enrollment at the University but given in absentia status by your department.
 - 4) Relocation to University-owned Family Housing.
 - 5) The Student graduates after signing a Contract, notifies the hall office, and leaves the Graduate Residence Hall before the beginning of the next semester. There is no refund if graduation takes place other than the end of the semester.
 - 6) Participation in Study Abroad, Co-Op, Internship Program, or Student Teaching out of the Champaign-Urbana area.
 - 7) Called to Active Duty for military service.
- b. **No Refund:** The entire \$150 advance payment is forfeited if a notice of cancellation is not received, postmarked before midnight May 15 (March 3 for Reassigned students), except for reasons in 5a. **An additional penalty also applies if the Student is enrolled, as noted in 4d above.**
- 6 **REQUEST FOR RELEASE FROM CONTRACT:**
- a. **Before Occupancy:** Written request for release within the time specified in section 3 should be addressed to: Housing Information Office, 100 Clark Hall, 1203 South Fourth Street, Champaign, IL 61820. The Student should indicate the reason for requesting cancellation and mail the request only to the above address. **Do not include the request in mail sent to other University offices as Housing is not notified of cancellation from other offices of the University and must be notified separately.** See section 5 concerning advance payment forfeiture.
- b. **After Occupancy:** Request for release from Contract after occupancy must be initiated at the Student's hall office. Reasons considered for release are listed in section 4. These reasons must be documented by the Student and verified by appropriate University staff. If a release is approved, the Student's account will be credited at the semester room and board rate for the type of room and meal plan then currently contracted for, effective the week the Student cancels the Contract, in percentages of 90% if canceled during the first or second week of the Contract, 80% the third week, 70% the fourth or fifth week, 60% the sixth or seventh week, 50% the eighth week, and 40% the ninth or tenth week. No credit will be given after the tenth week of the Contract either semester, and the \$150 advance payment will be distributed as described in section 5. **A Student vacating her/his assigned space before the end of the Contract period without written notification to the hall office and approval, will be held responsible for the entire Contract charge.**
7. **GENERAL PROVISIONS:**
- a. A Student must be enrolled at the University of Illinois to live in the Graduate Residence Halls. **The hall office must be notified in writing within ten days** if the Student withdraws from the University and/or moves out of the Graduate Residence Halls.
 - b. The Student agrees not to sell, sublease, or assign the Contract to anyone.
 - c. The Student agrees to comply with the "Graduate Residence Halls Contract, Academic Year 2009-2010" and all other University and Graduate Residence Hall rules and regulations governing the conduct of students which are now in effect and any that may be adopted and published by the University during the term of the Student's Contract.
 - d. Students are responsible for the conduct of their guests, and the Student agrees to obey visitation and guest regulations.
 - e. The University reserves the right to terminate the Contract by written notice if a Student fails to comply with any of the terms and conditions of the Contract and all other University and Graduate Residence Hall rules and regulations.
 - f. The University reserves the right not to enter into (and/or terminate) a residence hall contract for anyone who, in the judgment of the University, represents a threat to the health or safety of University students, employees, or other University constituents.
 - g. Smoking, halogen lamps, cooking in rooms, storage of cooking equipment, gambling, narcotics, controlled drugs, firearms, weapons, fireworks, commercial activity, and the housing of pets or laboratory specimens are prohibited

in the Graduate Residence Halls. The Student agrees to comply with the state, University, and residence hall regulations regarding alcoholic beverages.

- h. While every effort will be made to comply with Student preferences, full authority is reserved by the University to make assignments (and/or reassignments) of space in accordance with determinations made by the University. **The Student agrees to accept any accommodations she/he is assigned.**
- i. Changes in room assignment may be made only with the prior approval of the Student's Complex Director.
- j. In addition to the terms of this contract, students are subject to the Code on Campus Affairs and Handbook of Policies and Regulations Applying to All Students and may be required to move into another space or leave the Graduate Residence Halls, pursuant to sanctions imposed under the University disciplinary system.
- k. If a vacancy occurs in a double room, the remaining Student agrees to accept another roommate as assigned, or move into another double room if requested, or pay an increased rate for occupying the room as a single.
- l. The University reserves the right to consolidate vacancies.
- m. The University reserves the right, at its discretion, to determine that past behavior and/or criminal activity is such that the interests of the University, the Student, and/or other students would best be served by alteration or cancellation of a University of Illinois Housing Contract. If the University becomes aware that a resident has a record of criminal conviction(s) or other actions that could pose a risk to person or property and/or could be injurious or disruptive to the residence hall or apartment community environment, the University may not accept or may cancel the University of Illinois Contract.

8 DATES OF OCCUPANCY:

- a. The Student may move into the Graduate Residence Hall on August 20, 2009 (January 17, 2010, for the spring semester). A Student with a special need for occupancy prior to that date must submit an Early Arrival Request at http://www.housing.uiuc.edu/online/current/early_late_arrival.asp. Early arrivals may not be accommodated in their permanently assigned rooms. There is an additional cost for each day the room is occupied prior to the contract period. This early arrival fee is charged to the Student's account. The Student is billed for each semester of the academic year separately, and there is no charge for occupancy between semesters if the Student resides in the hall for the entire two semesters (three semesters if a 12-month contract). However, if the Student cancels the Contract according to a provision in Section 4 of the Contract and does not complete the entire two semesters, the Student will retroactively be charged a daily rate for the days occupied during semester breaks. If canceled prior to semester breaks, the Student must request approval from the Complex Director and will be charged a daily rate. The student may submit a contract extension request to the Complex Director to stay in their assigned room for up to 7 days after the last date of their contract in the Spring semester and be charged a daily rate. Students needing to stay longer than 7 days after the end of the spring contract must submit a summer contract. All requests to extend contracts must be submitted prior to the end of the contract. See the summer contract for specific deadlines and rate information.
- b. **A room assignment will not be held beyond the first day of classes** unless the office mentioned in section 6a above is notified in writing of the Student's intention to occupy the space at a later date. No refund will be given for the period the space is held unoccupied. **Failure to occupy the assigned space does NOT cancel the contract.**

9. **DINING SERVICES:** Dining Services is offered in nearby Undergraduate Residence Halls and is optional. Dining service begins August 20, 2009, for fall and January 17, 2010, for spring semester and continues through lunch on the last day of final examinations each semester. Meals are not served when the University is not in session or between semesters and meal plan rates are based on the number of serving days in a week. The deadline to change to a meal plan is September 23, 2009 for the fall semester and February 3, 2010 for the spring semester. Dining Services can be added to the Contract at any time.

10. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR ROOM AND FURNISHINGS:** The Student shall be responsible for maintaining his or her room in a reasonable condition at all times and to correct any abuse called to the Student's attention by University representatives. **Room furnishings shall not be removed without approval**, and public area or lounge furnishings shall not be moved into the Student's room. The Student shall be responsible for all damage to University property in the Student's room during the term of occupancy. University Housing reserves the right to enter the Student's room at any time, including the weekends, holidays, and vacation periods, for routine maintenance and building service work, life safety inspections, and/or for emergency purposes. Every student room comes with a Microfridge (a combination refrigerator, freezer, and microwave). These units are not optional, and remain in each room at no extra charge to the resident. It is the responsibility of each resident to clean and defrost his/her unit. Upon checking out of the hall, the unit must be left cleaned, defrosted, and in good condition. After checking out, residents will be charged if their unit is not cleaned (\$50.00) and defrosted (\$25.00).

11. **LOSS OF PROPERTY:** The Student shall be responsible for the security of her/his own property. The University shall accept no responsibility for the theft, damage, or other loss of money, valuables, or personal effects of the Student in or

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on University property, including storage rooms. The Student agrees that any personal effects, valuables, or other property of the Student left in the halls after expiration of the current Contract period shall be abandoned property and may be retained by the University as its property or may be disposed of through sale, donation, or in such other manner as the University in its sole discretion may determine. Any proceeds derived from the sale or other disposition of such property shall be the property of the University.

12. **TELEPHONE SERVICE:** Toll calls placed from residence hall room telephones will be billed directly to each Student. Students not wishing to accept responsibility for the payment of toll charges may cancel their ILLICALL charge number. Telephones are not provided in student rooms.
13. **CHANGES TO CONTRACT:** The University reserves the right to make changes to the "Graduate Residence Halls Contract" or in the applicable rates during the term of the Contract with 30 days notice.
14. **HOUSING SHORTAGE OR EMERGENCY:** In the event of a student housing shortage, the University reserves the right to increase the occupancy of residence Hall rooms or to assign students to other housing units, particularly large doubles, and lounges. In the event of a national or regional emergency, the University reserves the right to move and/or reassign a Student and to increase the occupancy of rooms. The University reserves the right to cut back to a limited menu dining service and/or consolidate serving units in the event of a work stoppage, fire, power outage, civil disobedience, riot, rebellion, acts of God, and similar occurrences.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **LINEN:** You must furnish your own linens, pillow, and blankets. Your room is furnished with an extra long twin-size bed (approximately 80" X 36").
2. **COOKING: Cooking is not permitted** in the Graduate Residence Halls except in small microwaves, or UL-approved appliances for the preparation of coffee, hot water, or popcorn. Other types of electric appliances (such as hot plates, ovens, toasters, or George Foremans) are strictly prohibited.
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY: Any evidence discovered of a resident cooking in the room may result in a charge of \$50 for the first offense, \$100 for the second offense, and \$150 for each offense thereafter. Charges will be billed for any damage to the leased room or furnishings as a result of violation of the no-cooking regulation.
3. **PARKING:** Application for a parking space will not be accepted prior to check-in. Parking spaces are assigned with priority given to current residents. All other applicants are assigned based upon date of application.
4. **Please note:** Due to State of Illinois Life Safety Codes, Daniels single rooms with shared bathrooms and most Sherman single rooms can **only** be locked from inside the bathroom, when the bathroom is in use. Either student room is accessible from the bathroom and the bathroom door cannot be locked from the student room side when someone is not in the bathroom.
